

Preface

Facts and Figures for Culture and Media Development Cooperation have been produced since 1998 by the Division for Culture and Media at Sida. In this edition of year 2005 we provide information for the fiscal years 2002–2005. In earlier editions we made it clear that all projects with culture and media components are not included due to restrained statistical formats. In spite of these limitations this publication does cover all culture and media sector development through Sida. It is interesting to note that a continuous increase in terms of disbursements is demonstrated while the total amount has tripled in five years.

It is my hope that the information in this document will be useful as background material for presentations and for the planning of future cooperation. Culture and media has gained a strategic platform within the organisation and will continue to serve as an important tool for the empowerment of poor individuals as well as promoting the voice of the poor.

Development Cooperation in Culture & Media in 2005

Objectives

One of the many dimensions of poverty is the lack of access to free speech and the arts. The essence of poverty is not only lack of material resources but also lack of power and choice. Poor people's access to their own cultural heritage or to opportunities for artistic creativity is often limited. In many countries, freedom of expression and the right to information are restricted – which hampers the democratic development needed for poverty reduction and human rights for all.

In recent years culture and media have played an increasingly important role in the struggle against poverty. They can empower people and give them strength by opening ways to knowledge, creativity, self-esteem and identification. Culture and media can increase individuals' opportunities to exert influence over their own situation and to participate in society.

The aim of Sida's culture and media cooperation is, consequently, to create conditions for cultural diversity, creative activities and opportunities for mass media to operate freely. All these components in turn contribute to the fulfilment of the overall objective of Swedish development cooperation – to help creating conditions that will enable the poor to improve their lives.

Culture and media activities are generally carried out using one of the following methods:

- Support to culture and media activities in developing countries.
- Analysis, research and debate on the role played by culture in social and economic development.
- Making the cultural perspective visible within development cooperation.
- Participation in methodological development of culture and media cooperation.
- Sida works with many international cooperation partners within culture and media; ministries of culture, NGOs and culture and media producers as well as national, regional, global non-governmental and inter-governmental organisations.

More than forty Swedish institutions – theatres, museums, universities, university colleges, cultural centres etc. – work in partnership with similar institutions in developing countries. The Swedish institutions channel Sida support to their cooperating partners in developing countries. Both

partners contribute their knowledge and experience in order to achieve poverty alleviation.

One of the most important target groups of Sida's culture and media cooperation is children and young people. This group forms more than half of the population in most of the poorest countries while they exercise least influence and power.

Sweden was one of the first countries to give culture a place in government development cooperation – first to a limited extent in the 1960s, and to an increasingly wider extent from the beginning of the 1980s when support to cultural activities designed to protest against the Apartheid regime in South Africa increased significantly. In recent years Sida's culture and media cooperation has continued to develop with an even sharper focus on poverty alleviation.

Support to media development also grew and developed during the 1990s. Its primary task has been to promote freedom of expression: this has mainly been through training programmes for journalists and support to organisations working towards this aim.

It is primarily the task of the Division for Culture and Media at Sida to work with direct support to these areas. Every year the Division in collaboration with the Swedish Embassies in partner countries, channels approximately SEK 200 million to culture and media cooperation in developing countries and globally. However, other Divisions and Departments at Sida also provide support to culture and media in order to achieve the desired results within their own fields of cooperation (health, urban development, development of democracy etc). Several Swedish organisations cooperating with the civil society in developing countries also receive support from Sida for culture and media projects.

Cultural heritage

Within the field of cultural heritage the priorities are technical assistance, training, exchange of experience and networking with an emphasis on cooperation between museums, north to south and south to south. The exchange goes in both directions and is today more often driven by regional initiative. The Swedish National Heritage Board (Riksantikvarieämbetet, RAÄ) cooperates with Sida and acts as a focal point on issues regarding cultural heritage. This includes channelling of funds to relevant projects, participating in international events of interest for the poor countries and in general, an expert to assist in the evaluation of proposals in the sector of cultural heritage.

Literature

The objective for Sida support to literature is to facilitate efforts to create and maintain a literate and reading environment, to protect and promote freedom of expression and to stimulate imagination. In an attempt to cover all the aspects it includes working with writers and publishers, distributors, reading campaigns, book fairs, publishing industry, rural libraries as well as national libraries. Regional cooperation is given priority.

Performing Arts

Performing arts includes drama, music and dance and support is given to amateur groups as well as professionals. Theatre is in many countries part of traditional cultural patterns -like oral literature- as a way of communication. Many people in rural as well as in urban areas are engaged and involved in community or popular theatre as a well-functioning instrument for information on gender, education, HIV/AIDS and environmental issues. Children's and young people's theatre is a priority.

Cross culture

Under this heading support to cultural activities containing many different artistic expressions is to be found. This includes cultural centres for children and adolescents and cultural funds. In a number of countries Cultural Funds supported by both the receiving country and Sida have been established in order to fund a diverse of cultural activities.

A substantial part is cultural exchange between professional cultural groups and individuals in developing countries and Sweden. This exchange programme is carried out by the Swedish Institute in Stockholm and the Swedish Embassies abroad, with a special grant from Sida.

Media

The over all objectives for Sida cooperation in the field of media are to promote Freedom of expression and to support a pluralistic and diversified media sector of sustainable independent media.


Main areas of cooperation are training of journalists, editors and broadcasting producers, networking and cooperation capacity within media sectors at national, regional and international level, local radio including community radio, and promotion of Freedom of Expression and Press/Media Freedom


Sida Culture and Media Cooperation 2005, by department

Sida Culture and Media Cooperation 2002-2005




2.3 Sida Culture and Media 2005 by Programme Area and Region


Sida Culture and Media Cooperation 2005 by sub-sector

Sida Culture and Media Cooperation 2005, Top twenty recipients





Cultural Heritage Cooperation 2005, by Region




Cultural Heritage Cooperation 2005, by Sida Department

Crossculture Cooperation 2005, by Region







Sida Media Cooperation 2005, Top twelve recipients




3.1 Tanzania

Sida has been supporting activities in the fields of performing arts, literature and cultural heritage in Tanzania since 1992. The target groups are children/youth and the general public. Gradually cultural support to Tanzania has been incorporated in the Country Programme during this period. A provisional agreement was signed in 1997 which included the Bagamoyo College of Art, the Children's Theatre Programme of Tanzania and the national drama project for secondary school girls. In 1998 Sweden signed a specific agreement with the Government of Tanzania regarding support to the Tanzania Culture Trust Fund. The agreement was renewed in 2002 for the period 2002–2005. The Trust Fund is an independent funding organisation which, within the framework of the national cultural policy, promotes and strengthens cultural actors, practitioners and activities throughout Tanzania by facilitating access to funds, sensitisation, lobbying and advocacy.

Tanzania Culture and Media Cooperation 2002-2005




3.2 Zimbabwe

The support to culture in Zimbabwe was incorporated into the bilateral Country Programme in 1997. The priority areas are performing arts, literature, film and music. The target groups are children and youth. In 2003 Sida initiated the establishment of a Culture Trust Fund, directed by an independent Board of Trustees which will finance small-scale projects. The Fund is currently being restructured, a process which is expected to be completed in September 2006. The financing of individual culture organisations (such as Chipawo, Amakhosi, Zimbabwe Film Festival Trust, Zimbabwe College of Music and Rooftop Promotions) will be terminated and as from October 2006 the Zimbabwe Culture Fund will be the sole Sida partner in the sector.

3.3 Mozambique


The Swedish support to culture in Mozambique dates back to the end of the 1980's. Since 1997 the culture support has been incorporated in the bilateral Country Programme. The focus has been on development of national museums and support to cultural centres in different provinces in cooperation with Västra Frölunda Kulturhus in Gothenburg. Ministry of Culture has also received support for capacity building and institutional development. The most well known theatre in Mozambique, Teatro Avenida, was the first cultural institution to get support from Sida.

An evaluation of the culture cooperation was carried out in March-April 2001. The findings from the evaluation were that most of the projects are relevant to the identified needs and to cultural policy and priorities as well as to the Swedish goals and principles for support to Mozambique. An important conclusion of the evaluation was that culture cooperation will remain a key component within the Swedish development cooperation.

Based on previous results and the evaluation a new support is now being developed. This support is to be channel directly to the implementing institutions at provincial level. Recent changes in legislation give cultural centres and museums economic autonomy and make this solution possible. UNESCO has been identified as the most suitable institution for the supervision of such an arrangement. The new support programme is scheduled to start in 2006.


3.4 South Africa

The Swedish support to culture in South Africa has a long history. It started already in the 1960s as a part of the anti apartheid assistance. Since 1994 culture has been part of the bilateral agreement between South Africa and Sweden. It has mainly been directed to cooperation between South African and Swedish institutions/NGOs in the culture field. Artistic education, music, performing arts, cultural heritage, visual arts, library exchange and reading promotion have been important areas in the cooperation. Culture exchange has contributed to important professional contacts between culture workers.

A process to create greater South African ownership and sustainability in the cooperation started in 2000. Seminars between the different parties in the cooperation have been held and studies carried out. This process has led to a joint Swedish-South African Culture Partnership Programme with joint funding. South African/Swedish culture institutions/groups can jointly apply for funds from this programme. The Swedish National Council for Cultural Affairs and the South African Department of Arts and Culture are responsible for the management of the programme. In the first two rounds of applications (2004 and 2005) a total of 21 joint projects have been granted financial support. In addition 23 planning grants have been distributed.

3.5 Regional Africa

The regional cultural support is concentrating on developing regional networks for professionals within the area of cultural heritage, in particular museums, book development/publishing and performing arts.

Programmes continue as planned within cultural heritage such as SAMP, Swedish-African Museum Programme, a twinning and networking programme between African and Swedish museums and AFRICA 2009 programme which comprises activities in cultural heritage preservation at the regional level including courses, seminars, research projects and regional networking. The regional programmes have been extended especially in East Africa with the East African Book Development Association (EABDA) coordinated by the book industry in three countries and in the Performing Arts continued support to East Africa Theatre Institute (EATI). All these activities should be regarded as long-term cooperation aiming at strengthening networks and capacity of professionals in the region.


The media support is largely a support to the training of journalists and other editorial staff, to advocacy for free and independent press and broadcasting media and to the establishing of community broadcasting.



3.6 Central America



Media support has been extended to media production, advocacy and to journalist training.



3.7 Occupied Palestinian Territories


Sida has been supporting culture and media in the Occupied Palestinian Territories since 1992/93. The main objectives from the start have been to encourage cultural life among children and youth in the fields of theatre, literature and music. About 400 000 children have been stimulated by reading and discussing books of fiction which have been distributed to schools, libraries and day-care centres. Reading campaigns are carried out. Several hundreds of school children have received theatre and drama education at school. The Dramatic Institute, Diakonia and the School of Music and Musicology in Gothenburg act as intermediaries concerning theatre, music and literature. Another priority is to support the semi-official preservation of traditional and historic buildings in the area of archaeology which is carried out by Riwaq, a multi sectorial institution. A national archaeological register is now completed.

Within the Agenda of Social Renewal for the period 1996-2000 Sida is supporting the development of a library programme and two Cultural Centres for children in cooperation with the Ministry of Culture. In the media field a training programme for journalists has been carried out at the Birzeit University in cooperation with FOJO (Institutet för Fortbildning av Journalister, University college of Kalmar). The only political and cultural journal edited jointly by Israelis and Palestinians is supported by Sida since 1994.

Occupied Palestinian Territories Culture and Media Cooperation 2002-2005





3.8 Vietnam

Sweden and Vietnam agreed in 2004 to continue the support to the training of journalists for another three years. The agreement includes support to all kinds of media, radio, television, newspaper and internet and is a collaboration with FOJO (Institutet för Fortbildning av Journalister, University college of Kalmar). In 2005 the agreement on support to the Vietnamese culture for sustainable development was signed. The programme covers five years and is a continuation of the previous phase. The programme includes cultural exchange, cultural policy for development and the preservation of intangible cultural heritage. The support to the Swedish-Vietnamese Fund for the promotion of culture continues since its establishment in 1992.


Vietnam Culture and Media Cooperation 2002-2005

A large part of the support aims at promoting cultural exchange between Sweden and developing countries around the world, through the Swedish Institute (SI).






