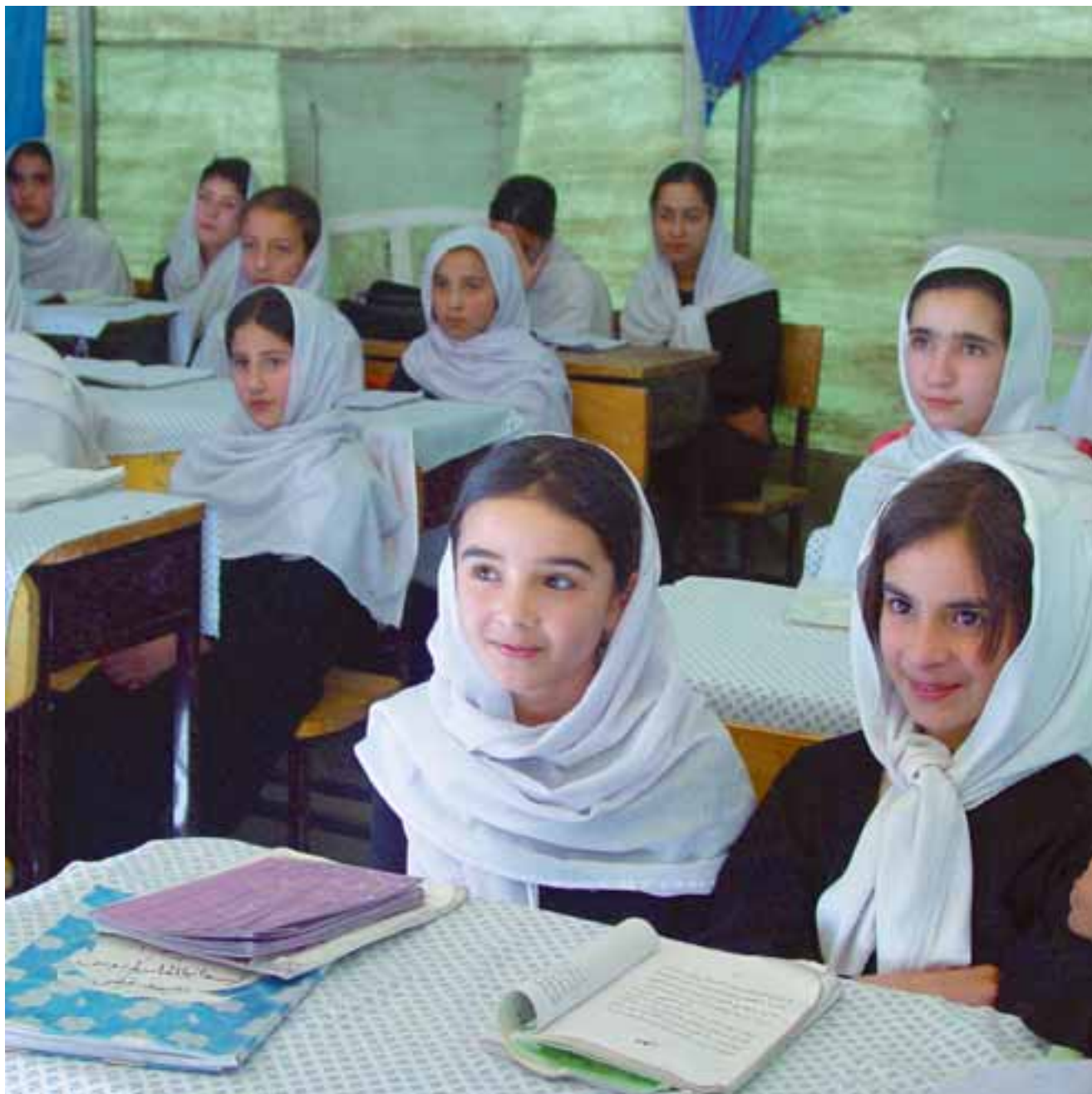

Preface

The overall policy goal of Sida's co-operation in the education sector is to enhance the right to relevant education for all – an education that empowers the poor and the excluded to participate as active and informed citizens in all aspects of development.

Since April 2001 Sida's education cooperation has been guided by a policy which emphasises education for all, human rights and basic needs.

Sida is committed to the six goals in "The framework for Action in Education for All" (EFA), adopted in Dakar in April 2000.

Sida is also strongly committed to the Millennium Development Goals of halving the proportion of people living in extreme poverty by 2015. Two of the targets concern education:

- The achievement of Universal Primary Education by 2015
- The elimination of gender disparity in primary and secondary education by 2005. This goal has not been achieved and calls for more urgent actions by all stake holders.

The policy emphasises the above goals as necessary building blocks for Sida's support in capacity development, education, training and research.

Sida's support for the education sector is always based on partner countries' own education programmes. Basic education and literacy for all children, youth and adults have been a priority of Swedish development co-operation since the mid-1970s.

With the introduction of Sida's education policy, there has been a shift from support for basic education projects or sub-programmes to support for partner countries' education strategies that prioritise basic education for all through a Sector Wide Approach (SWAp).

The main partners in the education sector cooperation are the ministries of education. Other partners are UN agencies and national and international (Swedish) non-governmental organisation.

Sida and development cooperation in the education sector 2005

Facts and Figures on Education describes Sida's development co-operation in the education sector during 2005. As in previous years the statistics are based on Sida disbursements.

Total Sida Education disbursements for 2005 represents 7.2 percent (compared to 9.3 % in 2004) of total Sida Development Cooperation disbursements in 2005. In 2005 Sida provided SEK 995 million to programmes classified as education programmes. The level of disbursements is lower than 2004 which is caused by a lower level of Humanitarian

Education Assistance through Sida/SEKA.

The majority of Sida's education cooperation, roughly 64 percent, is administered by the Education Division in the Department for Democracy and Social Development (DESO), in cooperation with Swedish Embassies. The remaining 36 percent is shared between several other departments in Sida. Ten countries now have support agreements with Sweden for Education Sector Programmes or programs in process towards full sector programs. Funding modalities varies, ranging from basket funding, off budget and on budget.

This transformation is affecting our statistics. Some of Sida's education sector programme disbursements now cover the entire sector. Therefore, several of our education disbursements can no longer be attributed to certain sub-sectors (such as adult literacy), although these areas may very well receive support as part of a sector programme. Another statistical problem is the growing number of budget support agreements which are not reflected in the statistics as contributions to different sub-sectors or not even to sectors in the recipient countries. Education Support to Rwanda and Mozambique is included in the overall budget support to these countries. In the case of Rwanda the part that is directed to education is indicated in the agreement but in the Mozambique case no such indication was made for 2005.

Acting at the global level Sweden has since July 2004 been one of two co-chairs of the "Education for All Fast Track Initiative" (FTI). It has mainly been the Education Division that has represented Sweden at FTI-meetings and in the steering committee. The co-chairs provide political leadership for the Initiative during their one year tenure, and serve as co-conveners of the FTI Partnership meetings. Sweden was asked to prolong its tenure as out-going co-chair until end July 2006.

The FTI aims to help countries attain the Universal Primary Completion by 2015 as expressed in the Millennium Development Goal, through mobilising additional resources and by creating a process for donors to support countries' education plans, emphasizing alignment, coordination and harmonisation. Sida has also provided financial support to FTI during 2005 by contributing to the Catalytic Fund. The Catalytic Fund provides short term funding (of two to three years) to help close the financing gap for countries with too few donors, while aiming to leverage more sustainable support through regular bilateral and multilateral channels. The FTI is a dynamic process which requires constant changes in light of partner countries realities.

The Education Division has also been co-chairing the Global Advisory Committee of the United Nations Girls' Education Initiative, UNGEI. The goal of UNGEI is to narrow the gender gap in primary and secondary education by 2005 and to ensure that by 2015, all children complete primary schooling, with girls and boys having equal access to all levels of education. UNICEF is the lead agency and the secretariat for UNGEI. Sida also provided financial support to UNGEI during 2005 through our ongoing agreement with UNICEF.

I hope that the Education Facts and Figures 2005 is a useful source of information in our continued efforts to develop education sector cooperation.

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1. Sida Education Cooperation.

1.1 An Overview of Swedish Education Cooperation

In 2005 Sida provided SEK 995 million for Education Cooperation. This represents a decrease of 174 MSEK compared to 2004 which is mainly the result of an equivalent decrease in the Humanitarian Education Assistance.

About 64 percent of the SEK 995 million was administered by DESO/ Education Division and the Swedish Embassies in the partner countries. The disbursed amount has diminished slightly (from 669 MSEK in 2004 to 636 MSEK in 2005). The amount represents 4.6 percent of Sida overall Development Cooperation in 2005, a decrease of almost one percent from the previous year (5.4 percent).

Primary Education received 54 percent (SEK 540 million) of the total Sida Education Cooperation disbursements in 2005. The figure for Primary Education is in fact larger as the General Sector Support to Mali contains a proportion directed to Primary Education which is not reflected in the above figures. In addition support to the Education Sector in Mozambique is not accounted for as this support is provided for through direct budget support and the statistics give no indication on the proportion that is directed to the education sector.

The region in the world that received most Education Support was Africa, which received almost half of all funds. The ten countries that received the majority of the disbursements were Tanzania, Afghanistan Ethiopia, Bangladesh, Bolivia, Honduras Mali, Uganda, Rwanda and Cambodia. For Afghanistan, the disbursements were made from the DESO/Education Division and the Country Programme as well as from the Department for Cooperation with NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance (SEKA). For Uganda and Ethiopia a large share came from the Department for Research Cooperation (SAREC).

The Education Development Cooperation was disbursed by the following organisational units at Sida:

- Bilateral (Country Programmes), Regional and Global Programmes received SEK 636 million (down from SEK 669 million in 2004) from the *Swedish Embassies* in the partner countries and the *Education Division* at the *Department for Democracy and Social Development (DESO)*.
- Education Development Cooperation through Swedish NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance amounted to SEK 179.4 million (a consid-

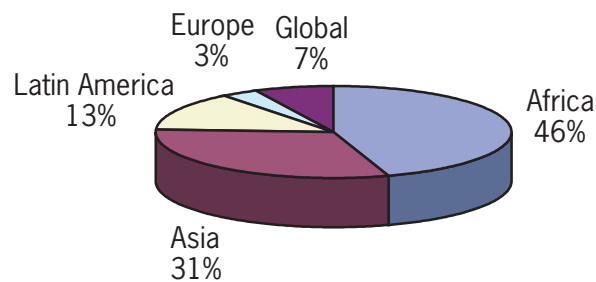
erable decrease from 2004, SEK 353 million) and was administered by the *Department for Cooperation with NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance (SEKA)*.

- Research Cooperation is administered by the *Department for Research Cooperation (SAREC)*. SAREC's total support for Higher Education and Research amounted to SEK 847 million and was distributed for bilateral cooperation and support for regional and global programmes. Bilateral research cooperation is mainly directed at supporting institutions for higher education and research. SEK 147 million of the total bilateral research cooperation is classified as support to Higher Education and accounted for in this report. Other bilateral research cooperation is classified under other sector headings.
- Education Development Cooperation with Central and Eastern European Countries amounted to SEK 27.4 million (SEK 26 million in 2004) and was administered by the *Department for Europe*.

1.2 Sida Education Cooperation by Geographical Distribution

Sida's Education Cooperation was during 2005 present in all developing regions of the world. Most support was given to the African Countries which represent 46% (MSEK 448) of total disbursements in 2005. Asian countries were supported by 31% (MSEK 308), Latin America by 13% (MSEK 133) and East and Central Europe by 3% (MSEK 35) of total disbursements in 2005. International organisations were supported by 7% (MSEK 71) out of the total disbursement in 2005.

Education Cooperation by Region, Total Disbursements 2005, MSEK 995

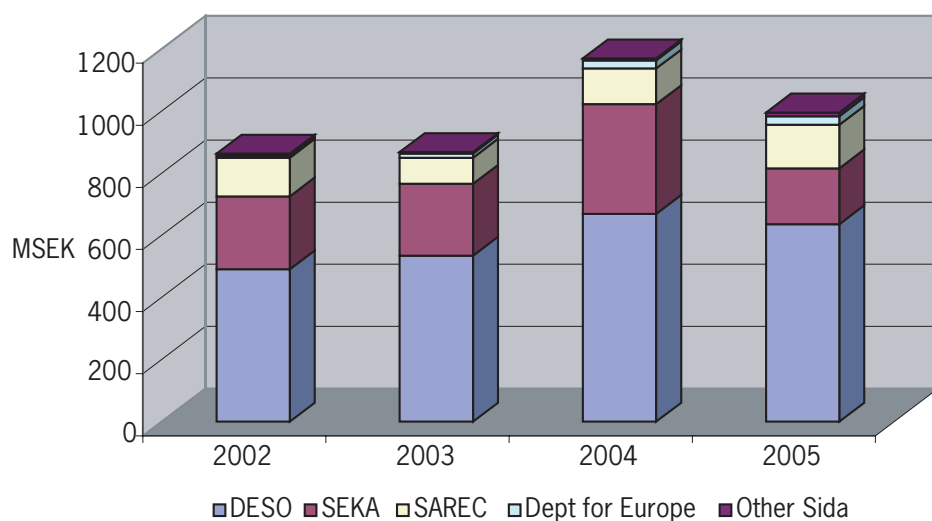

Sida Education Cooperation 2002–2005



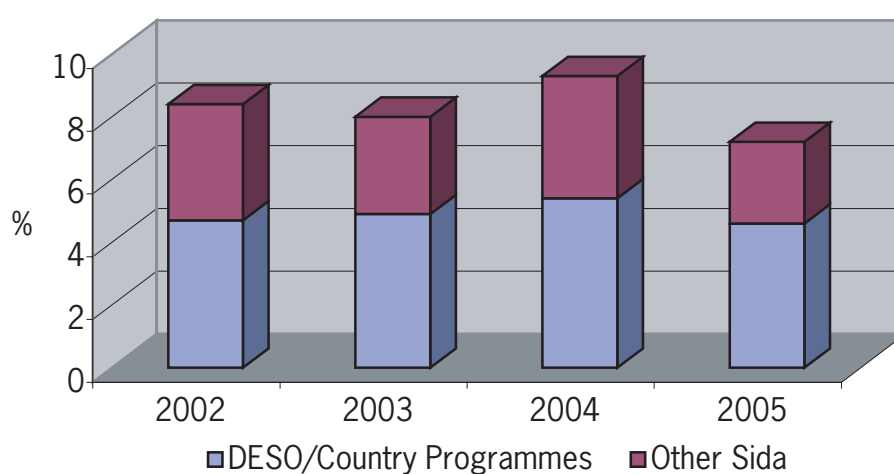

Education as proportion of total Sida 2002–2005

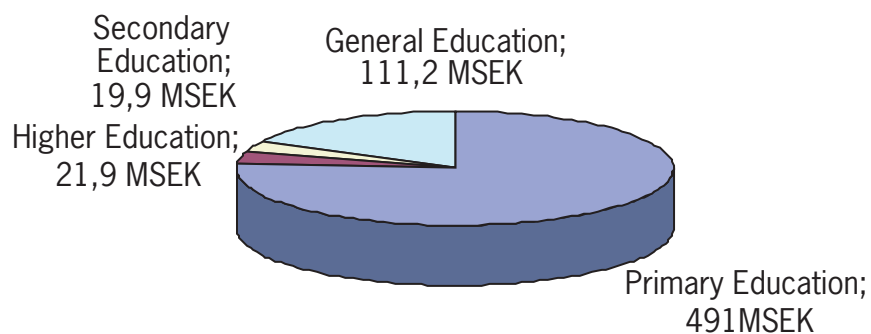

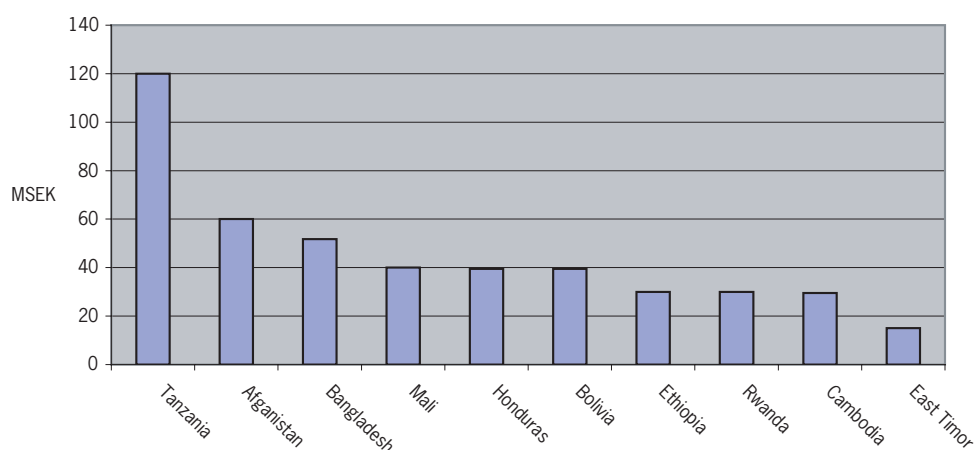

1.5 Education Sector Programme Support

Sector Programme Support has become an increasing part of Sida Education Cooperation. In 2005 455.3 MSEK was disbursed to Education Sector Programmes which represents two thirds of total DESO/ Country Programmes disbursements. A growing number of countries have reached long-term agreements with Sida on Education Sector Programme Support comprising all sub-sectors of the Education Sector. In some cases, i.e. Tanzania the support is primarily directed to the Primary Education sub-sector, while in others, i.e. Mali and Honduras the support is directed to not only Primary Education but Adult Education and other sub-sectors as well. Rwanda is a recipient of general budget support from Sweden. The agreement on budget support amounts to SEK 160 million for two years. Out of this SEK 30 million per year is directed to the education sector. In 2005 Sweden and Mozambique signed a two year agreement on budget support comprising the education sector. The education sector allotment for 2005 is however not included in this report.

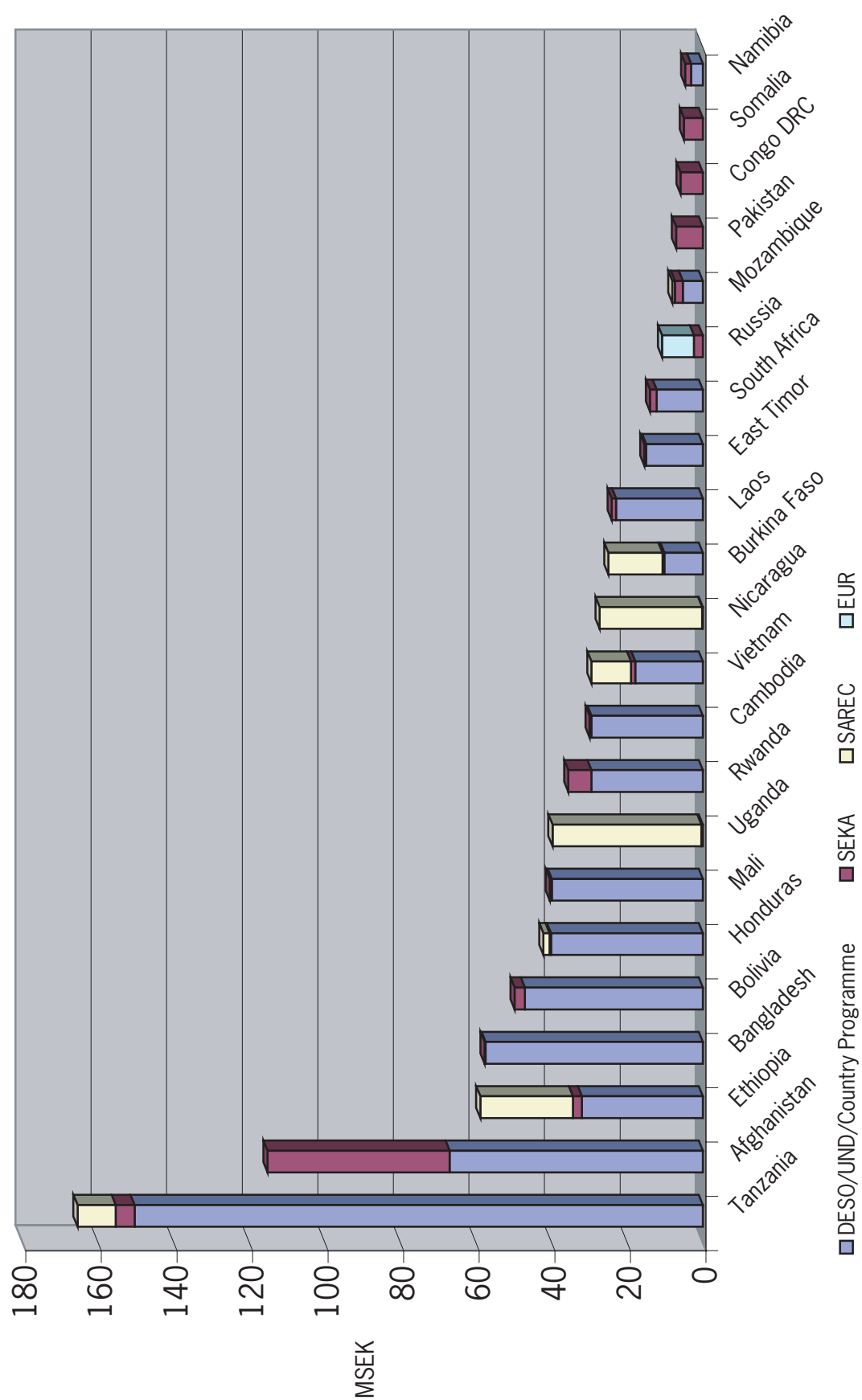

Sida Education Cooperation by country 2005

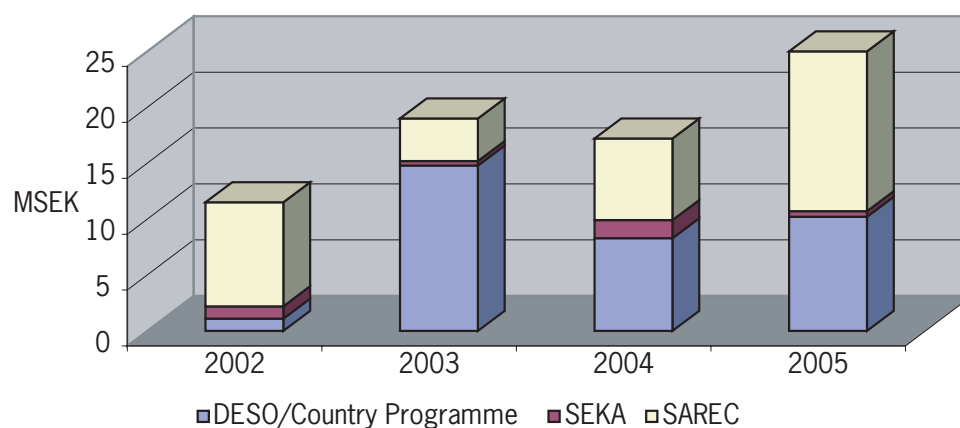

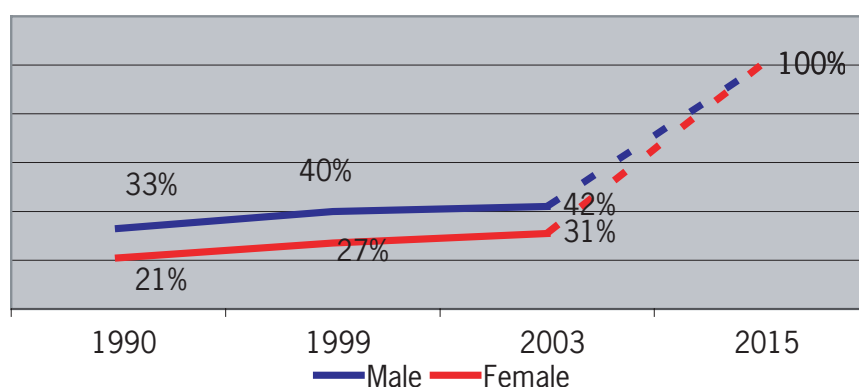

Burkina Faso Gender Parity Index (GPI) 2003: 0.73 (Millennium Goal 2005, 1.0)

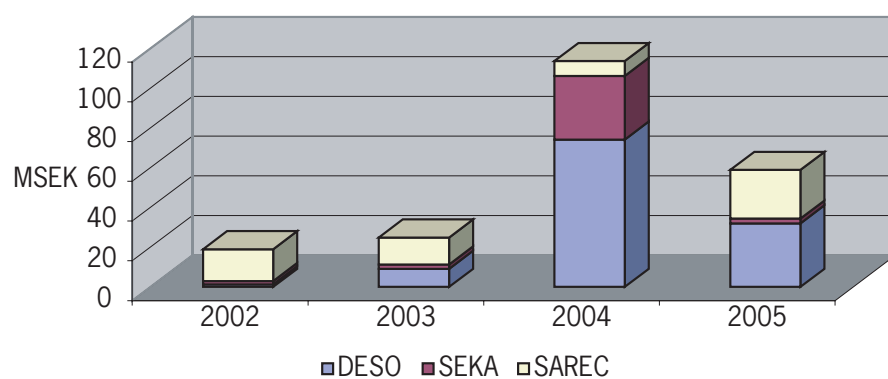

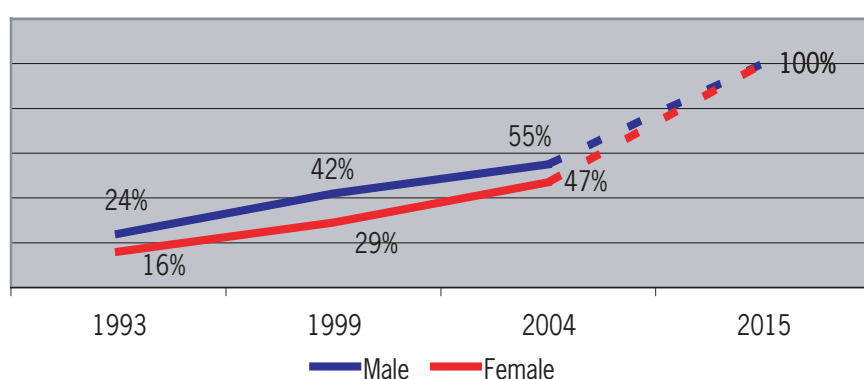

Ethiopia Gender Parity Index (GPI) 2003: 0.85 (Millennium Goal 2005, 1.0)

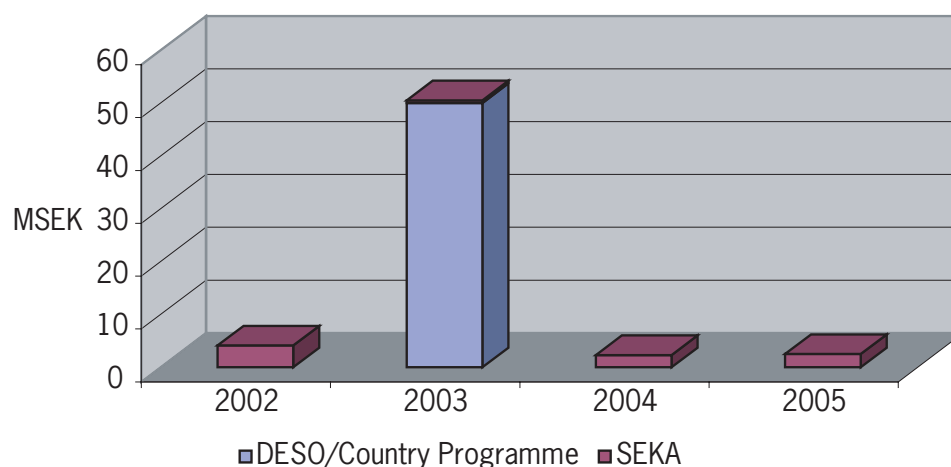

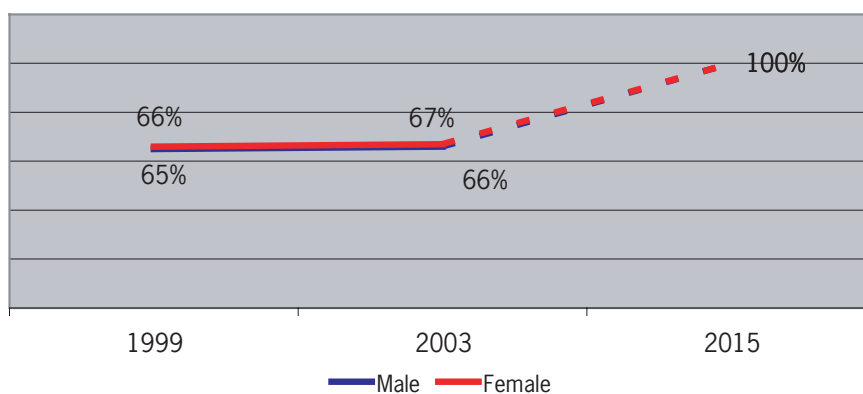

(Millennium goal 2015, 100%)



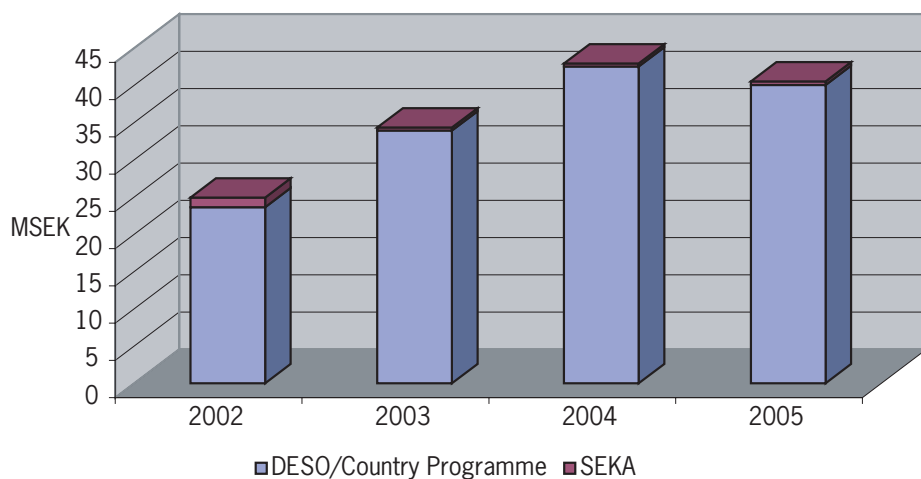

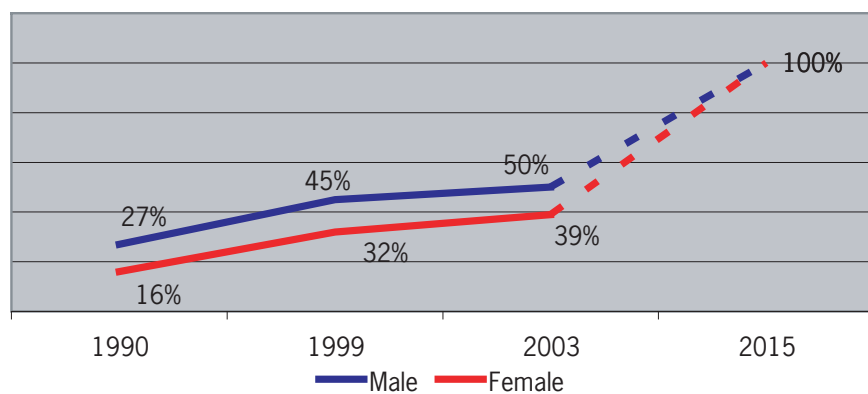

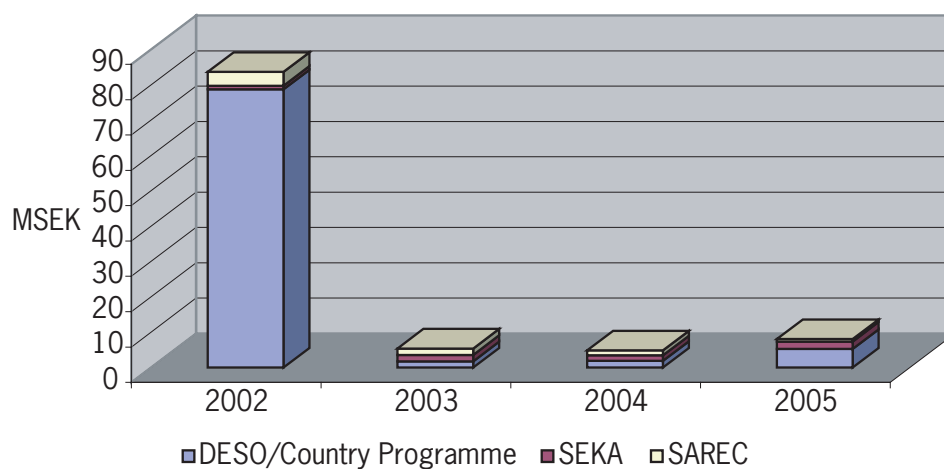

(Millennium goal 2015, 100%)



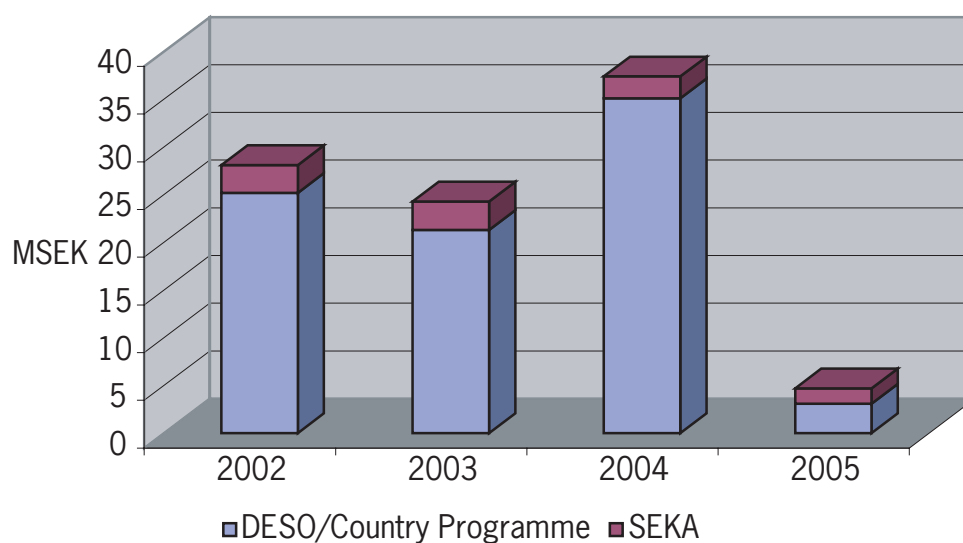

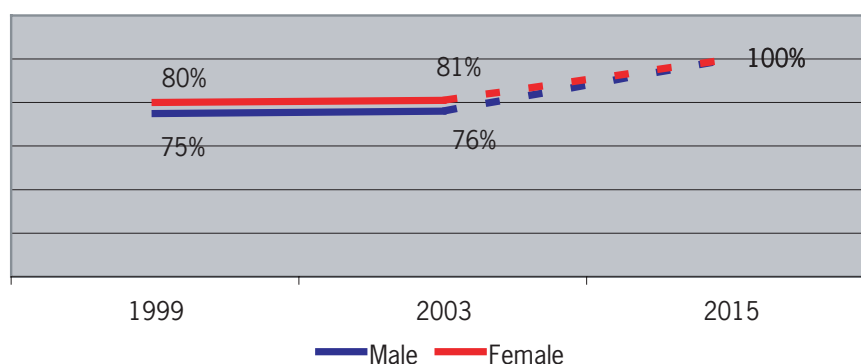

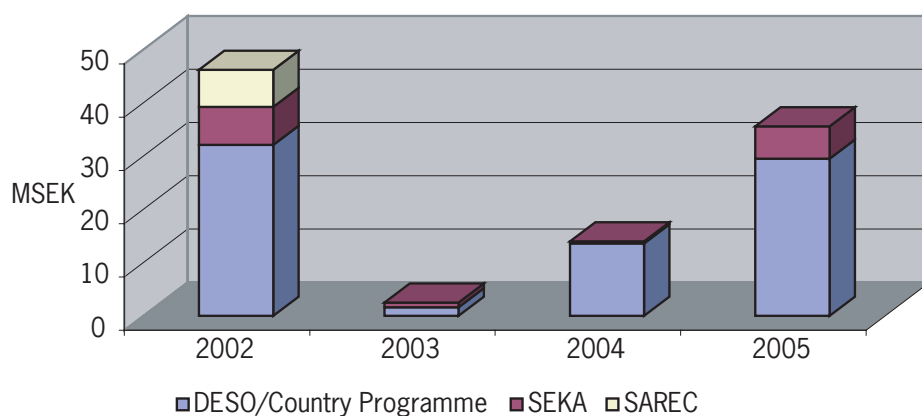

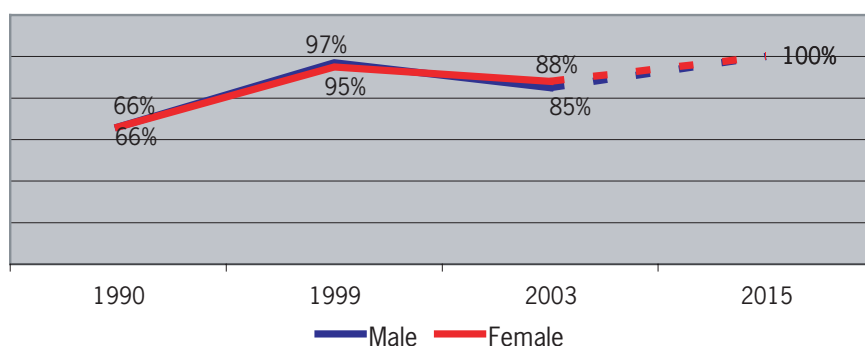

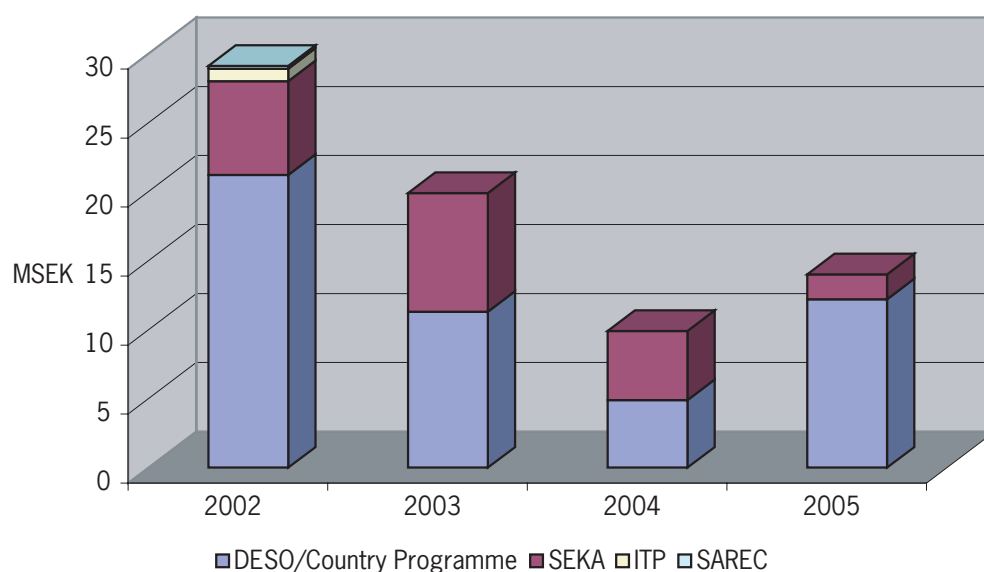

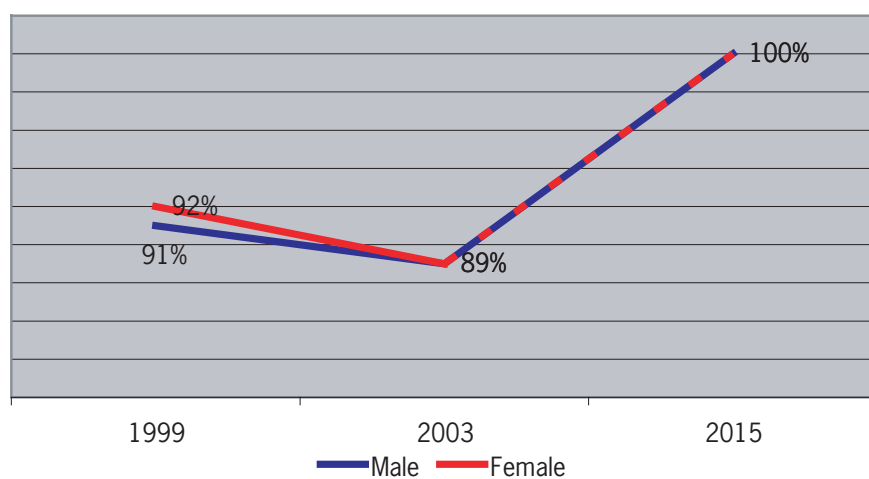
South Africa, Education Cooperation 2002-2005

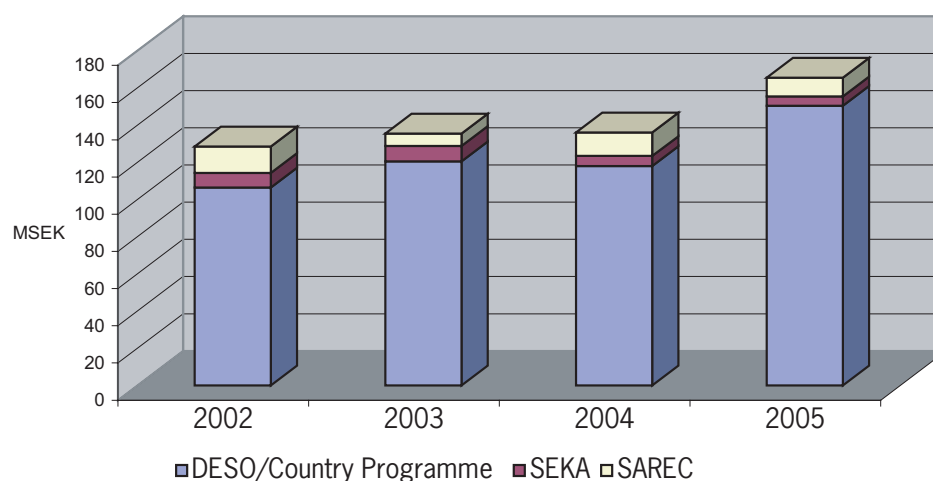

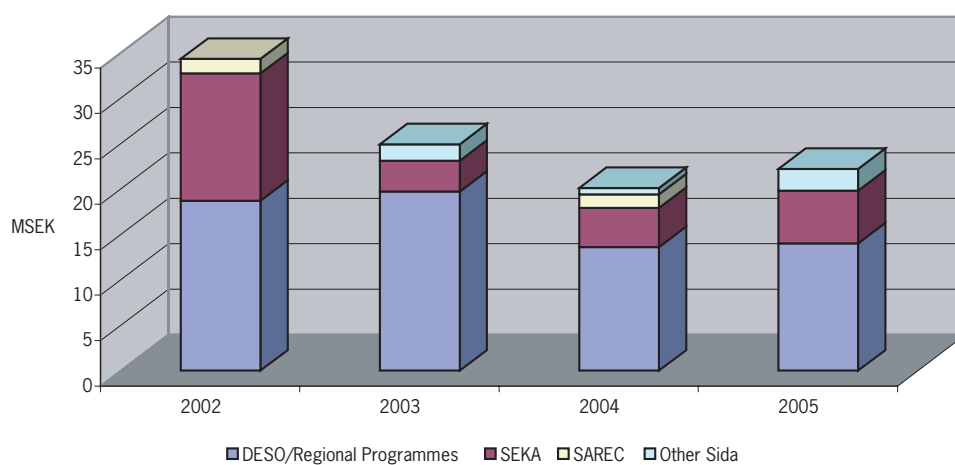

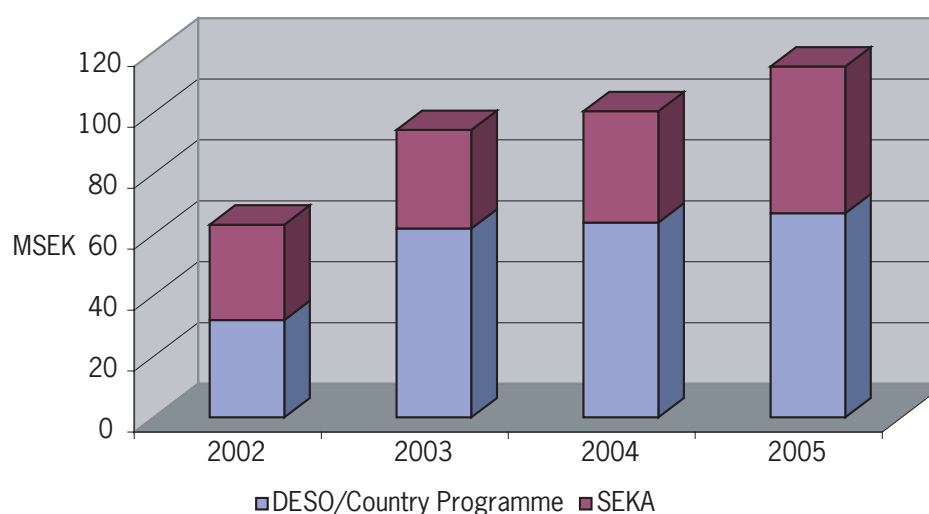

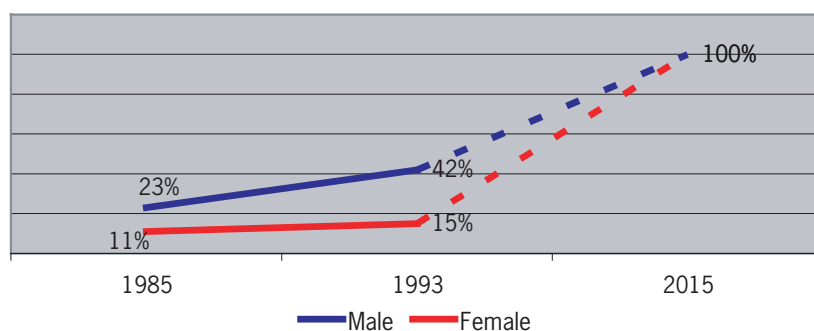

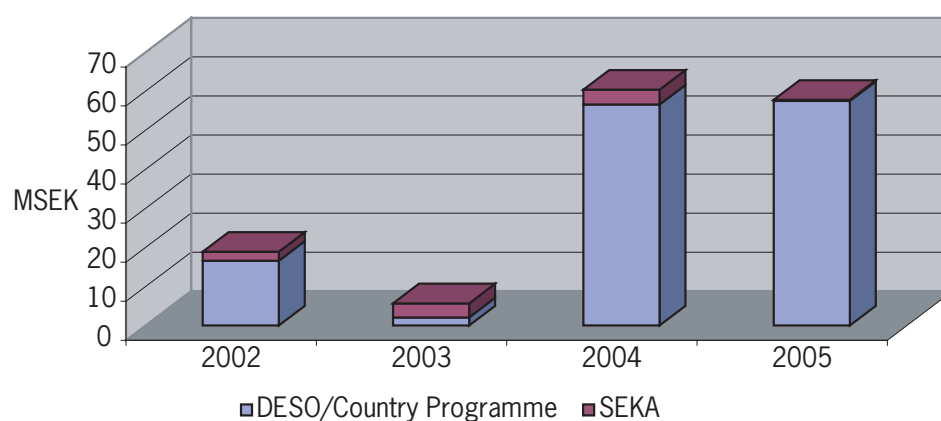

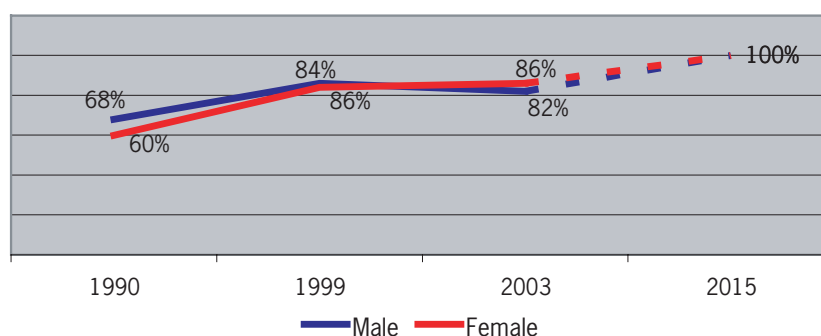

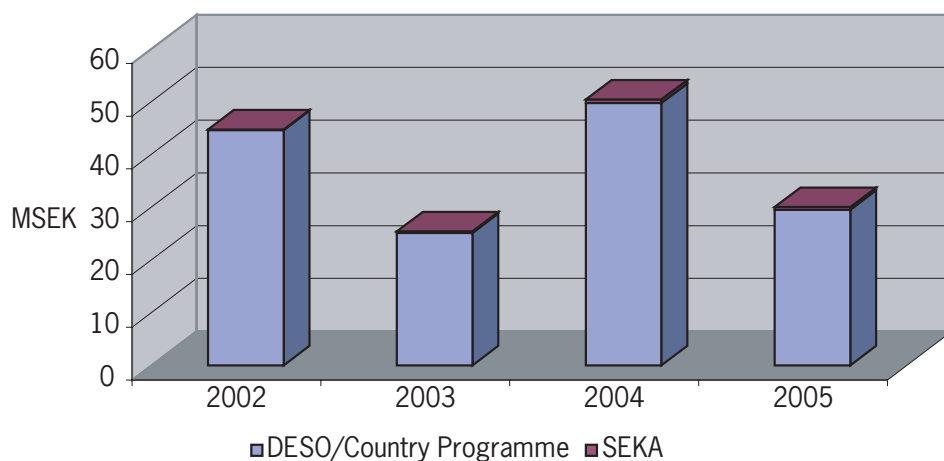

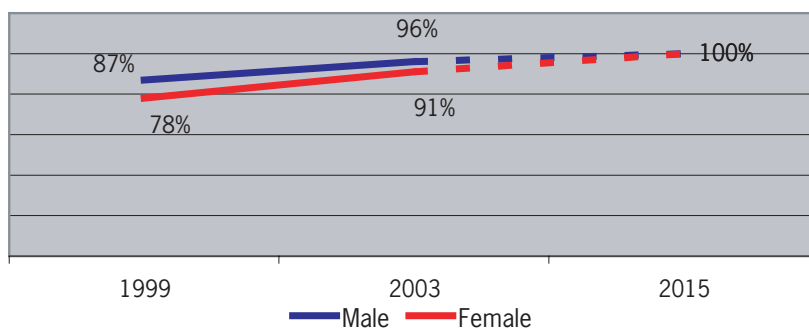

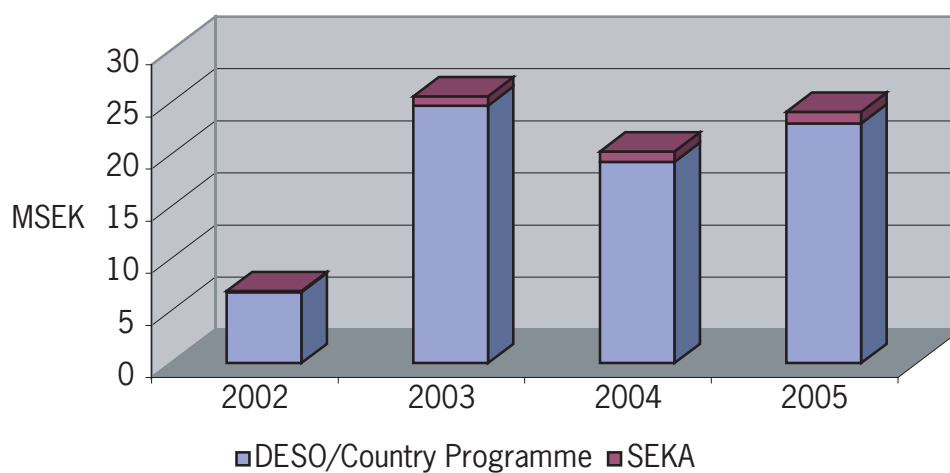

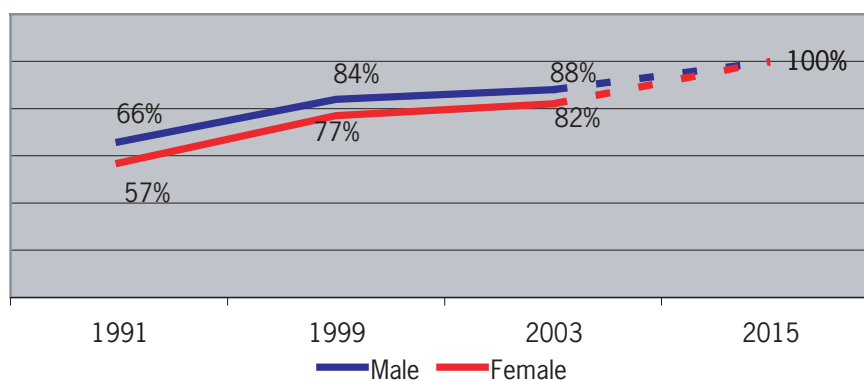

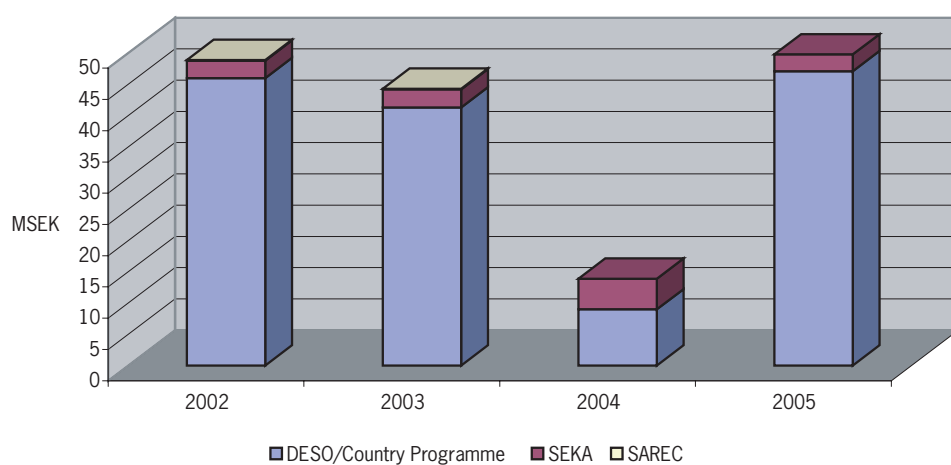

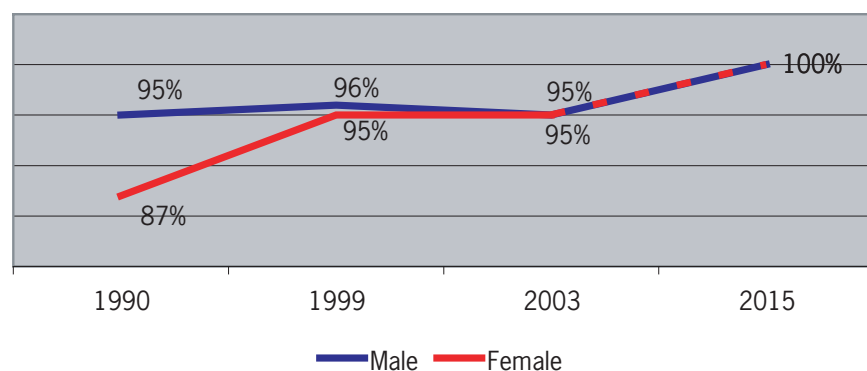

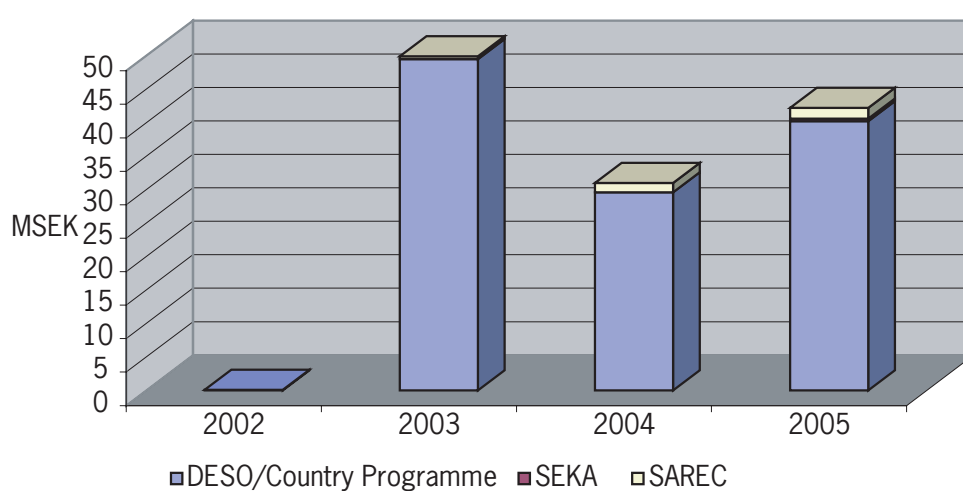

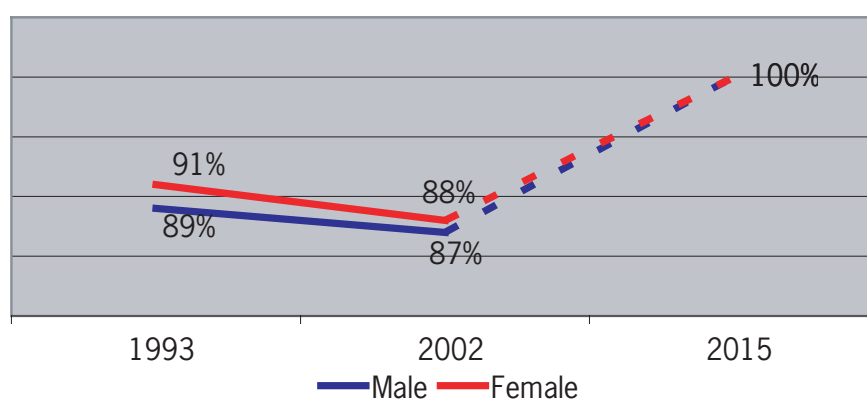
