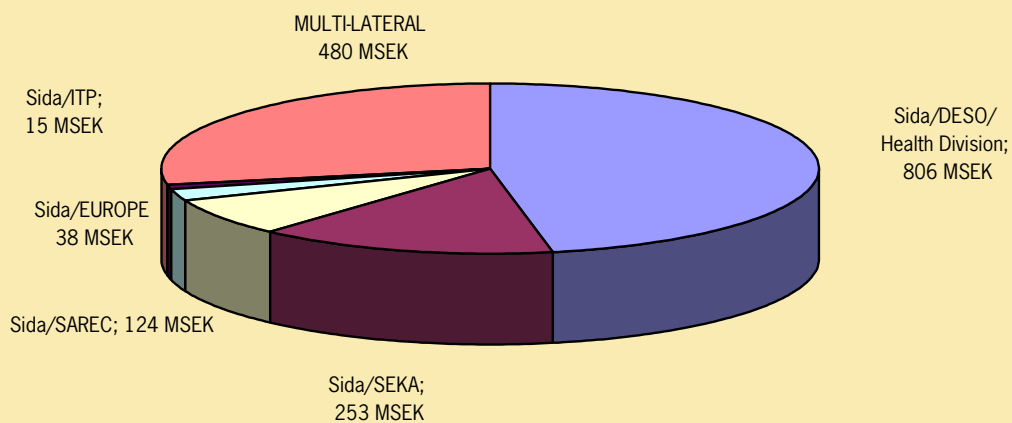

# Preface

This edition of Facts & Figures 2003, Health and Development updates information on development co-operation within the Health development for the fiscal year 2003. It also gives comparative figures from 2002, 2001 and 2000.

I hope that information available in this document will be useful as background material for presentations and for the purpose of planning future co-operation programmes. Information provided is based on disbursements made by Sida (i.e. not plans or budgets). A deviation in the support to a specific project/programme may be explained by delayed disbursements. It does not, therefore, necessarily signify a reduced or an increased allocation in comparison to previous years. The word contribution may be used in the report meaning the same thing as disbursement.

This report has two parts: the first one giving an overview of the support including graphs and summary tables, the second containing detailed tables of the support.

For further information on the different areas of the health sector co-operation, for policies, strategies or results in terms of outputs and effects, other documents are available at the responsible departments of Sida.

This edition of Facts & Figures covers all Swedish Government financed health sector development co-operation of which the main part is channeled through Sida. Sida's health sector co-operation is mainly channeled through the Health Division of the Department for Democracy and Social Development, DESO. However, most departments within Sida are engaged either directly or indirectly in the health development sector co-operation, in particular the Department for Co-operation with NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance, SEKA and in research co-operation through the Department for Research Co-operation, SAREC. Figures on health development sector support through all departments of Sida are included in this report.

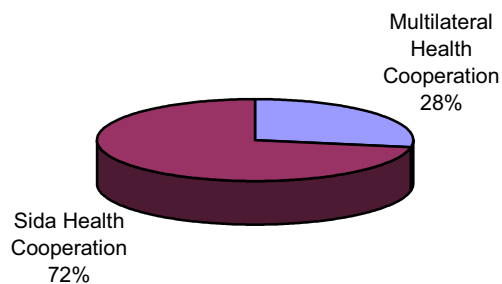

# 1. Summary of Facts & Figures for 2003

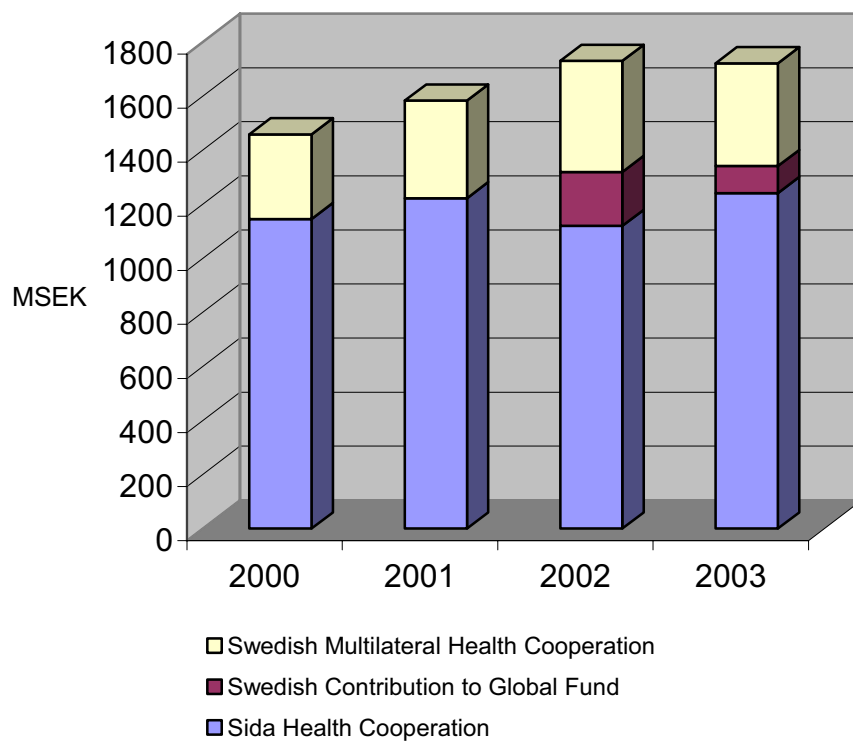
- The total Swedish Development Assistance for Health, 1 721 MSEK, constitutes approximately 10.5% of the total Swedish Development Cooperation.
- Sida disbursed in total 1 241 MSEK for Health Cooperation during 2003 while the Ministry for Foreign Affairs and the Ministry for Health and Social Welfare disbursed 480 MSEK, mainly constituting core multilateral funding to UN agencies. The disbursements by Sida increased slightly compared to previous year.

**Swedish Health Cooperation 2003.**  
**Total Disbursements 1 721 MSEK**



- The contribution to the Global Fund for fighting AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria in 2003 was 100 MSEK, which was 100 MSEK less than planned. This decrease in disbursement will be compensated in 2004.
- Sida Health Development Cooperation, MSEK 1 241 constitutes around 11.5% of total Sida cooperation, MSEK 10 797 in 2003.
- Of the Sida disbursements to Health, more than half of it (65%) was administrated through the Swedish Embassies in recipient countries or through DESO/Health Division.
- Both the DESO and Sida disbursements to Health increased from previous year.
- The area of Health Services (including district and sector support) is by far the largest programme area and has increased its share of the total Sida Health Cooperation.
- Africa was the continent receiving most (more than one third), other regions remained stable in comparison to last year, with a slight decrease for the health cooperation with Europe.

## 2. An Overview of Swedish Health Development Cooperation

The overall objectives for Sida's Health Development Cooperation are to promote:

- sustainable and effective health systems
- nation-wide coverage of health services of acceptable quality, according to principle of social equity and gender equality
- strengthened role for the health sector in influencing other sector policies towards better health.

The development cooperation aims at strengthening the capacity of national health systems and institutions and at providing financial and technical assistance for the implementation of different health programmes.

The main partners in the health sector cooperation are Ministries of Health. Other partners are UN agencies and international and national non-governmental organisations.

From Sida the Health Development Cooperation was disbursed by following organisational departments:

Bilateral and Regional programmes as well as Development Funds disbursed 806 MSEK or 65 % of total Sida Health Cooperation and were administered by the Swedish Embassies and the Health Division at the Department for Democracy and Social Development, DESO. The increase from 2002 is mainly explained by the step-up of health cooperation in Africa, mainly support to HIV/AIDS programmes.

Health Development Cooperation through Swedish NGOs and Disaster Relief amounted to 253 MSEK or 20 % and was administered by the Department for Cooperation with NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance, SEKA.

Health Research Cooperation amounted to 124 MSEK or 10 % and was administered by the Department for Research Cooperation, SAREC.

Health Development Cooperation with Central and Eastern European Countries amounted to 38 MSEK or 4 % and was administered by the Department for Central and Eastern Europe, Sida-EUROPE. The drastic decrease of funds is due to the administrative change of health projects from EUROPE to DESO/Health Division. 66 MSEK was disbursed by DESO/Health to European countries. Hence total disbursements to these countries remains the same from 2002.

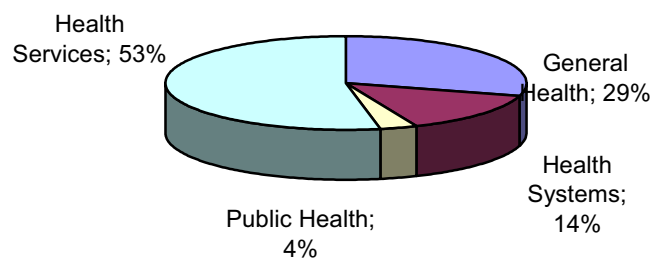
International Courses amounted to 15 MSEK or 1 % and was administered by the Sida Division for International Training Programmes, ITP.

# 3. Sub-sectors

The Sida Health Sector Cooperation can be divided into four sub-sectors or programme areas:

- Health Systems Development amounted to 176 MSEK
- Health Services including Sexual and Reproductive Health and HIV/AIDS amounted to 657 MSEK
- Public Health amounted to 44 MSEK
- General within Health Care amounted to 364 MSEK

by Sub-sectors 2003**



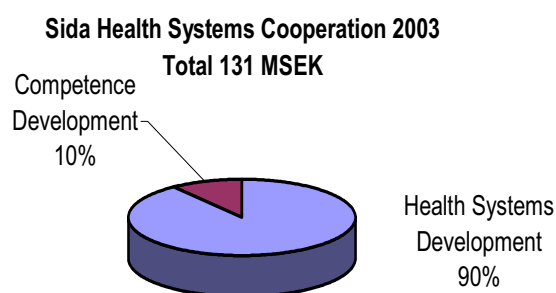
## 3.1 Health Systems Development

There is a growing interest for the health systems and what health systems can do to promote health. The work on Health System Development focuses on issues that relates to the functioning of the overall health system. It is concerned with issues such as health sector reform, health policy formulation, the organisation of

the health sector and the financing of its activities. Equity concerns are always on top of the agenda when discussing the health system.

Within the area of health systems, a wide range of activities has been carried out. Examples of this work include the development of so called National Health Accounts, support to WHO activities in the area of Health Systems, Regional Network on Health Economics and Health Policy in Southern Africa, Courses on Health System Development (together with INEC, see below), the role of hospitals, the role of the private sector studies on sector wide approach and pharmaceuticals.

Other areas of closer analysis are decentralisation within the health sector and its effects on poverty, democratisation and gender equity, health care financing, and contracting within the health sector.

### 3.2 Health Services incl. Sexual and Reproductive Health and HIV/AIDS

The second main area for Swedish Health Development Cooperation is **Health Services**. The area includes Child Health Care, Reproductive Health and Rights (RHR), Sexual Health and Rights (SHR) including HIV/AIDS, Disease Control, Rehabilitation of Disabled People, Medical Drugs, and Mental Health.

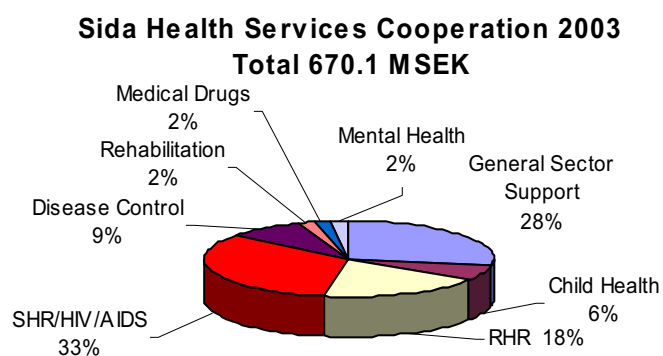
The aim of the co-operation in this field is multifaceted. Women and men should be able to avoid illness and disability in their sexual and reproductive lives, and be able to have the number of children they wish. To reduce maternal mortality and morbidity is one major component in this area. In order to achieve this, Sida has selected a number of strategic areas in which to focus its attention. These are:

- Increased awareness of international human rights treaties and conventions with relevance for gender equality;
- Access to effective reproductive health services provided by trained health professionals before and during pregnancy, at delivery and for newborn children;
- Attention to methods to make abortions safe;
- Develop good youth friendly health services and enhance sexuality education for young people;
- Support work against female genital mutilation;

- Enhance analysis and actions against gender-based discrimination and violence.
- Protect, support and promote breastfeeding especially among working women

As to **HIV/AIDS** Sida works towards the following goals:

- to enable people to protect themselves against HIV infection irrespective of sex, marital status or age;
- to encourage greater political commitment to HIV prevention programs;
- to allow people infected and affected by HIV/AIDS to pursue their lives with quality and dignity;
- to develop coping strategies to alleviate long term effects of the epidemic.



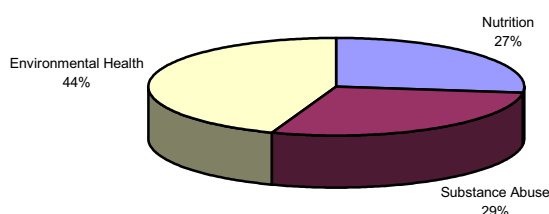

### 3.3 Public Health

Public Health has recently become a third important area of Sida. Health services play an important role in promoting and protecting health. But, in the long term, education, food, water, sanitation, housing, work and the broader physical and social environment are even more important determinants of the health and well-being of a population. This has become particularly obvious in connection with the intensified global effort to combat poverty. Public Health interventions address all those sectors in society which have significant influence on the health of the population, in particular on the health of vulnerable groups with the poorest health status. They are primarily of a promotive and preventive character, often aiming at influencing behaviour and lifestyles. The Public Health Area includes Nutrition incl. Breastfeeding, Substance Abuse Issues, Environmental Health and General within Public Health.

Sida has produced a paper to highlight the relationship between health and development and continues to explore an approach to Public Health which would be relevant to Sida's development cooperation with partner countries.

### 3.4 General within Health Care

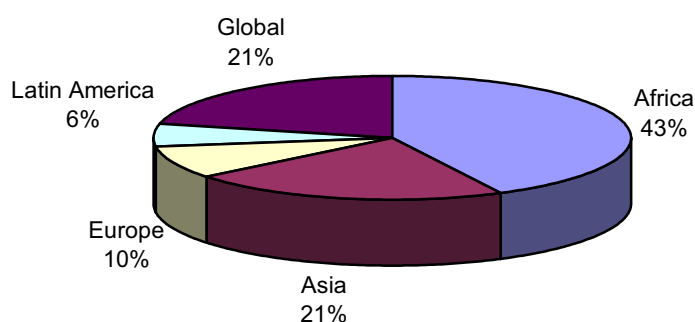
A large part of the Sida Health Cooperation is general support to health in situations where a classification in subsectors is impossible and not necessary as i.e. in emergency situations. For this reason the Sida department responsible for Humanitarian Aid and Support to NGOs, SEKA is the department which does most of the cooperation in the General Health Sector.

# 4. Geographical Distribution

Africa received 43% of the total health cooperation disbursements during 2003, an increase from 39 % in 2002. The drastic increase of health cooperation in Africa is mainly due to the step-up of HIV/AIDS programmes, but also emergency aid has increased in Africa.

# 5. Funding

## 5.1 DESO: Country Programmes and Special Programme

The largest share of the DESO health development cooperation consists of Special Programmes and support to bilateral Country Programmes, including health cooperation in Sida Programme Countries and regional programmes.

The disbursements for 2000-2003 by programme area and by Country Programme are provided in the Table Annex. The tables indicate the distribution of funds between programme areas and components based on the Sida system of classification of activities. The Special Programme funds were channelled mainly to or through UN agencies, NGOs and institutions.

## 5.2 Sida EUROPE

One of four goals for Swedish cooperation with countries in Central and Eastern Europe, financed through Sida Department for Central and Eastern Europe, is to support a socially sustainable economic transition. Support to the health sector is mainly aiming at reform of the health care system and development of public health activities. The Sida EUROPE health projects will gradually be included in the Country Programmes and handled by DESO/Health Division. In 2003 some, mostly Balkan Health Projects, have been transferred to the Country Programmes.

## 5.3 SEKA

Approximately 10 % of the total disbursements from the Sida Department for Cooperation with NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance (SEKA), to development activities through NGOs are directed to health sector related projects and programmes. The development support through Swedish NGOs is being channelled through (13) so-called frame- or umbrella organisations that in turn distribute the Sida funds to more than 300 individual organisations.

The Sida support to Humanitarian Assistance (Disaster Relief) included support through national NGOs and through the UN system.

## 5.4 ITP

The Sida Department for International Training Programmes (ITP) offers a wide range of technical courses in the International Training Programmes. The dominating themes focused on Sexual and Reproductive Health (SHR), Nutrition and Occupational Health. The SHR programmes aim at the improvement of sexual and reproductive health and rights by actions in health care along with intersectorial action in society. The Occupational Health programmes aim at giving the participants the capacity to initiate and monitor systematic actions for improving occupational safety, health and work productivity to fit the conditions of participant countries.

## 5.5 SAREC

Swedish development cooperation in the area of research is mainly channelled through the Sida Department for Research Cooperation (SAREC). Health research is supported as part of bilateral programmes of research cooperation



with a number of developing countries, mainly Vietnam, Mozambique, Tanzania and Ethiopia. These programmes aim to contribute to the development of national research capacity.

SAREC also supports international and other special health research programmes of relevance for development countries. This includes substantial contributions to the HRP, TDR and other research programmes within WHO as well as support to ICDDR/B in Asia. SAREC also supports international initiatives (such as COHRED and Global Forum for Health Research) engaged in promoting essential national health research as well as international partnerships in research, addressing the health problems of developing countries.

Finally a small part of SAREC's budget is devoted to health development research carried out by Swedish research institutions with a view to promote the involvement of Swedish scientists in research cooperation with Third World countries.

## 5.6 International Organisations

Sweden has a long-standing involvement in the reform of the UN system.

As concerns the field of health, the **World Health Organisation, WHO** is recognised as the main actor. In cooperation with the Swedish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Health and Social welfare a policy dialogue has been on-going in order to make Swedish aid more effective and to influence the reform process of WHO. The Swedish core contribution to WHO in 2003 was 40 MSEK disbursed by the Swedish Ministry of Social Welfare.

**UNICEF** has for many years been entrusted with a large core support from Sweden. Sida has also channelled funds through UNICEF for implementing bilateral programmes in some countries. Special programme support to certain normative work is also provided. The Swedish core contribution to UNICEF in 2003 was 300 MSEK disbursed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Approximately 25% of this core contribution is estimated to be utilised for the health sector, 75 MSEK.

The cooperation with **UNFPA** consists mainly of financial core support from Sweden and policy level meetings. The Swedish core contribution in 2003 to UNFPA was 205 MSEK. Sweden has increased its contribution to UNFPA over the last few years and will continue to do so.

**UNAIDS**, the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS, is a programme cosponsored by six UN organisations with the purpose to co-ordinate the UN efforts on HIV/AIDS prevention and care. The focus of UNAIDS is to strengthen the capability of the countries to respond effectively to the AIDS epidemic. The six cosponsors are UNDP, UNESCO, UNFPA, UNICEF, WHO and World Bank. The Swedish contribution to Regular Budget (core contribution) in 2003 was 60 MSEK disbursed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

**The World Bank** is the largest actor on the global health assistance arena. The DESO/Health Division has cooperation with the World Bank both at global policy level and on country level through the co-financing of a Health Programme in Bangladesh.
