# **Preface**

Facts and Figures on Education describes Sida's development cooperation in the education sector during 2004.

The figures from 2004 show a significant increase in the Education Sector Cooperation's share of Sida's total disbursements. The total disbursements in real terms for Education Cooperation have also increased significantly and have this year exceeded one billion Swedish kronor by a considerable amount. As in previous years the statistics are based on Sida disbursements.

The majority of Sida's education cooperation, roughly 60 percent, is administered by the Education Division in the Department for Democracy and Social Development (DESO), in cooperation with Swedish Embassies. The remaining 40 percent is shared between several other departments in Sida. The most prominent among these are the Department for Cooperation with NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance (SEKA) and the Department for Research Cooperation (SAREC).

SAREC support for Higher Education is included in this report. However, this support represents only a fraction of the total SAREC support for Research Development in developing countries.

The Education Division remains committed to transforming education development cooperation from many small education projects or sub-programmes into sector-wide education support. As a result ten countries now have support agreements with Sweden for Education Sector Programmes or programmes in process towards full sector programs.

This transformation is affecting our statistics. Some of Sida's education sector programme disbursements now cover the entire sector. Therefore, several of our education disbursements can no longer be attributed to certain sub sectors (such as adult literacy) or activities (such as education materials), although these areas may very well receive support as part of a sector programme.

Acting at the global level Sweden has during the fall of 2004 been one of two co-chairs of the "Education For All Fast Track Initiative" (FTI). The Education Division has also played an active role and at several meetings been the Swedish representative. The co-chairs provide political leadership for the Initiative during their one year tenure, and serve as co-conveners of the FTI Partnership meetings.

The FTI aims to help countries attain the Universal Primary Completion by 2015 as expressed in the Millennium Development Goal, through mobilising more resources and by creating a process for donors

to support countries' education plans, emphasizing alignment, coordination and harmonisation. Sida has also provided financial support to FTI during 2004 by contributing to the Catalytic Fund. The Catalytic Fund provides short term funding (of two to three years) to help close the financing gap for countries with too few donors, while aiming to leverage more sustainable support through regular bilateral and multilateral channels.

The Education Division has also been co-chairing the Global Advisory Committee of the United Nations Girls' Education Initiative, UNGEI. The goal of UNGEI is to narrow the gender gap in primary and secondary education by 2005 and to ensure that by 2015, all children complete primary schooling, with girls and boys having equal access to all levels of education. UNICEF is the lead agency and the secretariat for UNGEI. Sida also provided financial support to UNGEI during 2004 through our ongoing agreement with UNICEF.

I hope that the Education Facts and Figures 2004 is a useful source of information in our continued efforts to develop education sector cooperation.

# Summary

In 2004 Sida provided SEK 1 156 million to programmes classified as education programmes. The level of disbursements has exceeded last years figures by a considerble amount. Total Sida Education Cooperation now represents 9.3 percent of total Sida Development Cooperation in 2004.

About 58 percent (SEK 669 million) of the SEK 1 156 million was administrated by DESO/ Education Division and the Swedish Embassies in the partner countries. This amount represents 5.4 percent of Sida total Development Cooperation in 2004, an increase of a half percent from the previous year (4.9 percent).

Primary Education received 61 percent (SEK 700.3 million) of the total Sida Education Cooperation disbursements in 2004. The figure for Primary Education is in fact larger as the General Sector Support to Mali, Rwanda and Namibia contains a part directed to Primary Education. However, the present classification system does not reflect this fact.

The region in the world that received most Education Support was Africa, which received half of all disbursements for Education. The ten countries that received the majority of the disbursements were Tanzania, Ethiopia, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Mali, Somalia, Namibia, Uganda and Honduras. For Afghanistan and Ethiopia, the disbursements were made from the DESO/Education Division and the Country Programme as well as from the Department for Cooperation with NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance (SEKA). For Somalia the disbursements came only from SEKA and for Uganda, they mainly came from the Department for Research Cooperation (SAREC).

# 2. Sida Education Cooperation.

#### 2.1 An Overview of Swedish Education Cooperation

The overall policy goal of Sida's cooperation in the education sector is to enhance the right to relevant education for all — an education that empowers the poor and the excluded to participate as active and informed citizens in all aspects of development.

Since April 2001 Sida has had a policy for cooperation in the education sector, *Education for All – A human right and basic need*.

Sida is committed to the six goals in "The framework for Action in Education for All" (EFA), adopted in Dakar in April 2000.

Sida is also strongly committed to the Millennium Development Goals of halving the proportion of people living in extreme poverty by 2015. Two of the targets concern education:

- Ensure that, by 2015, children everywhere, boys and girls alike, will be able to complete a full course of primary schooling.<sup>1</sup>
- Eliminate gender disparity in primary and secondary education levels no later than 2015.

The policy emphasises the above goals as necessary building blocks for Sida's support in capacity development, education, training and research.

The policy is based on internationally agreed concepts and goals declared in Human Rights conventions and declarations.

Sida's support for the education sector is always based on partner countries' own education programmes. Basic education and literacy for all children, youth and adults have been a priority of Swedish development cooperation since the mid-1970s.

With the introduction of Sida's education policy, there has been a shift from support for basic education projects or sub-programmes to support for partner countries' education strategies that prioritise basic education for all through a Sector Wide Approach (SWAp).

The main partners in the education sector cooperation are the ministries of education. Other partners are UN agencies and national and international (Swedish) non-governmental organisation.

In 2004 Sida provided SEK 1 156 million for Education Cooperation an increase from 2003 by almost 300 million (SEK 868 million in 2003).

The Education Development Cooperation was disbursed by the following organisational units at Sida:


- Bilateral (Country Programmes), Regional Programmes and Development Funds received SEK 669 million (up from SEK 535 million in 2003) from the Swedish Embassies in the partner countries and the Education Division at the Department for Democracy and Social Development (DESO).
- Education Development Cooperation through Swedish NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance amounted to SEK 339 million (a considerable increase from the previous year's, SEK 231 million) and was administered by the *Department for Cooperation with NGOs and Humanitarian Assistance (SEKA)*.
- Research Cooperation is administered by the Department for Research Cooperation (SAREC). SAREC's total support for Higher Education and Research amounted to SEK 773.2 million and was distributed for bilateral cooperation and support for regional and global programmes. Bilateral research cooperation is mainly directed at supporting institutions for Higher Education. In 2004 this support amounted to around SEK 250 million. SEK 115 million of this sum is classified as support to Higher Education which is accounted for in this report. The rest is shown under other sector headings.
- Education Development Cooperation with Central and Eastern European Countries amounted to SEK 26 million (up from SEK 13 million in 2003) and was administered by the *Department for Europe*.




# Education as proportion of total Sida Cooperation 2001-2004




## 2.3 Sida Education Cooperation by Geographical Distribution

Sida's Education Cooperation was during 2004 present in all developing regions of the world. Most support was given to the African Countries which represent 50% (MSEK 576) of total disbursements in 2004. Asian countries was supported by 27% (MSEK 314), Latin America by 9% (MSEK 106) and East and Central Europe by 4% (MSEK 26) of total disbursements in 2004. International organisations were supported by 10% (MSEK 120) out of the total disbursement in 2004.

#### Sida Education Cooperation 2004, top ten recipient countries





#### DESO/Country Programmes 2004, by sub-sectors Total Disbursements 669 MSEK




General Education includes Education Policy Support, Technical Assistance to the Ministry of Education etc. and education cooperation not classified under other programme areas. In the case of Mali the support goes to the whole Education Sector and is represented here. The total SEKA support to Swedish NGOs is classified as General Education.

#### 2.5 Education Sector Programme Support

Sector Programme Support has become an increasing part of Sida Education Cooperation. In 2004 480.4 MSEK was disbursed to Education Sector Programmes which represents more than two thirds of total DESO/Country Programmes disbursements. A growing number of countries have reached long-term agreements with Sida on Education Sector Programme Support comprising all sub-sectors of the Education Sector. In some cases, i.e. Tanzania the support is primarily directed to the Primary Education sub-sector, while in others, i.e. Namibia where the support is partly directed to Higher Education and Mali, Honduras where the support is directed to not only Primary Education but Adult Education and other sub-sectors as well. Mozambique is one of the Education Sector Programme Countries. During 2004, however, no funds were disbursed to Mozambique due to misuse of Sweden's funds. The Governement of Mozambique has repaid 3.2 million SEK to Sweden in 2004.








Burkina Faso, Sida Education Cooperation 2001-2004

Burkina Faso, Net Enrolment, male and female 1990-2001 (Millennium goal 2015, 100%)






Eritrea, Sida Education Cooperation 2001-2004

Eritrea, Net Enrolment, male and female 1991-2001 (Millenium goal 2015 100%)







E hiopia, Net Enrolment, male and female 1993-2001 (Millennium goal 2015 100%)








SEKA supports Swedish NGOs which in turn perform activities in developing countries. The SEKA support goes to a number of so called framework organisations. These organisations work in different sectors in the developing world. In order to secure quality of the SEKA support, SEKA carries out audits and studies. In 2003 SEKA carried out a study on the framework organisations' activities in the education sector. Some of the findings from the report: NGO Cooperation within the Education Sector financed by SEKA/EO, Boman, Forsberg and Peck, March 2005 is presented here.

The framework organisations active in the education sector are;

Africagrupperna (Africa Groups), Pingstmissionens u-landhjälp (PMU Interlife), Rädda Barnen (Save the Children, Sweden), Forum Syd, UBV (Utbildning för Biståndsverksamhet), Svenska Kyrkan (Swedish Chuch), Diakonia, SHIA (Svenska Handikapporganisationernas Internationella Biståndsstiftelse) and Svenska Missionsförbundet.


The study covered 301 education projects financed by SEKA through the nine framework organisations. In 2003 the nine organisations disbursed SEK 135 million in the education sector.
